

Information following your gastroscopy, colonoscopy, or sigmoidoscopy

Information for patients from the Trust's Endoscopy Units

- A copy of your endoscopy report will be sent to your GP within one to two working days.
- Results of any samples taken will be sent to your GP and endoscopist.
- An outpatient appointment for......will be sent to you.
- An appointment for......will be sent to you.

If you have had sedation

- You must have someone to take you home, and stay with you for the rest of today and overnight.
- Do not drink alcohol for 24 hours.
- Do not drive or operate machinery for 24 hours.
- It is not advisable to sign legal papers or make important decisions for 24 hours.
- The sedation may affect your ability to work tomorrow.

If you had the local anaesthetic throat spray

• You can have a drink as soon as your swallowing is back to normal (anywhere between 20 to 60 minutes).

If you have had Entonox

• You must not drive for 30 minutes after you last used it.

Getting back to normal

- You may eat and drink as normal (avoid drinking alcohol for 24 hours).
- Any abdominal discomfort or wind should settle over the next 12 hours.
- If you have any loss of blood (more than just spotting) when opening your bowel, or persistent abdominal discomfort or vomiting you must ask for further advice.
- You may have a mild sore throat if you had a gastroscopy, but this will pass and is nothing to worry about.



• You may notice that your bowels do not return to normal for a few days following a flexible sigmoidoscopy or colonoscopy procedure.

If there is anything you are unsure about, please speak to the nurse before you leave the Endoscopy Unit.
