

### Low-Tech AAC - Core Words and Food and Drink

This resource can be used to combine words to in order to form phrases/short sentences:

- The cells are colour coded to aid selection.
- The **Core Words** (green cells in left two columns) are frequently used words. These can be selected to start a phrase/short sentence.
- The words in the right two columns on page 1 are **Categories**; on page 2 are some examples of words within the 'food and drink' category.
- The client can either point to the words or their conversation partner can point/ point and say the words aloud (Partner Assisted Scanning, PAS). See separate hand out on- line for advice on PAS.
- This is a flexible tool, so words can be also used singly e.g. "stop".
- Please note that for this resource to be useful all categories should be personalised for your AAC user.

Examples of how words can be combined:

- "food and drink → water"
- "want → food and drink → water"
- "I → want → food and drink → water".
